2019 EUROPEAN WOMEN'S AMATEUR GOLF RANKING



The European Golf Association would like to congratulate the top-three ranked players of the European Women's Amateur Golf Ranking, who receive formal recognition for their achievements in the form of an EGA medal. The final rankings, taken one day before the start of the European Tour Qualifying School (2 September) are (as shown above):

FRIDA KINHULT, who finished in second place to Albane Valenzuela in the 2018 ranking, has earned the gold medal this season. So far this year, the Swedish player, who competes on the Florida State Collegiate golf team, won the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate, helped the Continent of Europe to victory in the Vagliano Trophy, and scored the winning point in Sweden's second successive European Ladies' Team Championship title. She also became the first Swedish player to reach the top spot in the World Amateur Golf Ranking, enjoying seven weeks as the number one ranked women's amateur player in the world this summer.

ALBANE VALENZUELA finished top of the European Rankings last year and will receive a silver medal for her second-place finish this season. This year, the Swiss player won her third Vagliano Trophy with the Continent of Europe, finished tied first in the Pac-12 Championship, runner-up in the U.S. Amateur Championship, and also made the cut at the ANA Inspiration (T66) and the Evian Championship (T37).

ALESSIA NOBILIO has earned a bronze medal for finishing third in the European Rankings. Earlier this year, the Italian player finished runner-up in both the Italian and Spanish International Ladies' Amateur Championships, and won her national Ladies' Stroke Play Championship title. After helping the Continent of Europe to the Vagliano Trophy victory in June, Nobilio was instrumental in Italy's bronze medal at the European Ladies' Team Championship.
