

Att : Players and staff

Everyone (players, guests, staff...) must respect and follow these regulations which are essential requirements of our events being able to be played.

In any case, players and guests must follow national and local COVID-19 guidelines at all times.

Venues have been asked to operate enhanced hygiene and social distancing measures, which are critical to minimising risk for everyone.

Intentional breach of the regulations and healthy measures will be penalised and that may extend to removal from the tournament.

A player who would not own a sanitiser will not be allowed to start the round and would be disqualified. If a player fails to wash or sanitise his hands before handling a flagstick, rake or stake is likely to incur a penalty for a breach of the behaviour code.

Caddies are strictly forbidden and only one person can be with the player, this person is not allowed to give any advice and must comply with the Health and Safety plan.

Testing: We will not operate a testing system and will not require a Test to access the tournament.

Common Practices:

- Wear a mask in all indoor areas and outdoor when social distancing is not possible
- Wash hands frequently and follow all the health measures
- Disinfect your equipment frequently
- Behave in a socially distanced manner at all times.

Everyone must bring his own masks and hand sanitiser. However, masks and disinfectant will be sold at the club.

General Etiquette and Behaviour Expectations:

- Always adhere to recommended social distancing measures
- No shaking hands and contact of any kind (fist bumps, high fives, hugs...)
- Wash your hands with soap and water frequently
- If soap and water are not readily available, use hand sanitiser
- Sanitise hands after each hole
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth
- Sneeze or cough into a tissue, or inside your elbow
- Wear a mask while onsite and in the designated areas (subject to local health guidelines)
- Gatherings will be limited to ten people.

General Golf Etiquette:

Players must possess a sanitiser in order to start the round and make every effort to fulfil normal tasks during a round of golf, including but not limited to:

- Removing, raking and replacing the rake in the bunkers (sanitise hands before and after the handling)
- Removing, tending and replacing the flagsticks (sanitise hands before and after the handling)
- Retrieving the golf ball from the hole
- Repairing pitch marks and divots
- Removing and replacing the stakes (sanitise hands before and after the handling)

Starting:

- Starting: Players will receive the pin positions and local rules by email the day before. They will also be available on the official notice board.
- Players are required to supply their own pencils.
- A small pack of tees will be given to each participant during the registration
- There will be no exchange of paper scorecard, players will write the scores of the three players on their own card

Recording:

- No seating for the players
- Players are required to wear a mask and stand minimum 1 metre apart.
- Score Cards will be checked verbally and handed to the recorder.

Medical certificate of no contraindication to the practice of golf:

According to the French laws and rules, all players must forward a medical certificate dating from less than one year to the French Golf Federation or bring it with them on the tournament.

We draw your attention to this important rule in the conditions of play. This measure is to be used in all sports and by all competitions' organizers who can be recognized as responsible.

Therefore, the French Golf Federation must receive the medical certificates duly filled by a doctor even if your players are well insured when they travel abroad and if a medical assistance covers all expenses.

We know that some countries do not issue such certificates to their players. Therefore, you will find hereunder a form-sheet "medical certificate already personalized" to know what information needs to be on it.

All players are required to have a doctor filling in this medical certificate and to send it to inscription@ffgolf.org or bring it with you.

The player won't be able to take part in the tournament if he didn't fill and send this document.

We hope you understand our position according to the French law and are looking forward to welcoming you in France.
