

### PENATI GOLF RESORT

The world-class 36-hole golf facility Penati Golf Resort is a singular project in Slovakia and a newcomer on the map of the top golf resorts in Central Europe. It is situated in the region of Záhorie, near the town of Senica, not far from the czech-slovak border and less than an hour drive from two large cities Vienna and Bratislava.

Nature's ingenuity in this area of Záhorie knows no bounds. By taking advantage of its environmental characteristics, and factoring in the needs of sport at a top-notch level, the beauty and diversity of this area became the underlying reasons for building this unique golf resort and contributed to the creation of a true golfing gem. The grounds of the expansive Penati Golf Resort encompass 217 hectares of breathtakingly preserved environs.

It consists of two 18-hole courses of the highest quality: LEGEND COURSE and the HERITAGE COURSE. St Andrews Trophy 2022 is going to take place on the 18-hole course LEGEND COURSE bearing the signature of the world-famous design school Nicklaus Design. The resort boasts

the longest hole in Central Europe at 712 m (779 yards) with 11 tees. Golfers appreciate the short game practice areas - 2 large putting greens and a large chipping area.

A sizeable driving range of 98 yards by 295 yards is situated alongside the lake. Players enjoy the option of hitting from covered stalls or from grass. With its uncommonly large size and distinctive features Penati Golf Resort is the first golf complex in Slovakia designed to meet all expectations of a broad range of golfers. Players can enjoy golf from early spring to late autumn

in the beautiful surroundings of the Small Carpathians, amidst fragrant pine forests and shimmering white bunkers.

Penati Golf Resort, Member of the The World of Leading Golf, ranked among the TOP 100 Golf Courses of Continental Europe, is the proud holder of the prize EUROPE ENVIRO OSCAR 2012 for respecting and protecting the countryside's natural beauty.

The 2020 contest was cancelled due to the Covid-19 pandemic.Great Britain and Ireland won the match in 2016 on home soil at Prince's and also in 2014 at Barseback in Sweden.Forfar's Stuart Wilson is the non-playing captain of the GB&I team.
