

LA MANGA CLUB, SPAIN

The South Course has been the venue for many major professional tournaments, including several Spanish Opens, PGA Championships, for both men and women. At almost 6,500 metres from the white tees, it has water hazards on 15 of its 18 holes, wide fairways and a good combination of short and long holes.

The front nine are particularly challenging with two par 3s in excess of 200 metres and some daunting par 4s, which call for accurate driving between lakes and bunkers. The back nine, although shorter, has a number of intriguing dog-leg holes.

SIR MICHAEL BONALLACK



Sir Michael Bonallack (born 31 December, 1934) is an English amateur golfer who was one of the leading administrators in world golf in the late 20th century. He has an exceptional amateur record in golf. He won the British Boys Championship in 1952 and, remaining an amateur in

the era when professional domination of the sport became firmly entrenched, he went on to win the Amateur Championship and the English Amateur Championships five times each and the English Amateur Stroke Play Championships four times. He was a member of nine Walker Cup teams and played in the Eisenhower Trophy seven times. His best finish at the Open Championship was eleventh in 1959. He was the leading amateur at the Open in 1968 and 1971.

Sir Michael was Secretary of the Royal and Ancient GolfClubofStAndrewsfrom1984to1999andCaptain of the Royal and Ancient in 2000. He has also been Chairman of the PGA of Great Britain and Ireland

(1976-81), Chairman of the Golf Foundation (1977-82), and President of the English Golf Union (1982). He also had spells as President of the One Armed Golfers Society, the British and International Greenkeepers Association, and the Professional Golfers Association of Europe and as Chairman of the advisory committee for the Official World Golf Rankings. He received an OBE for services to golf in 1971 and was knighted in 1998. In 1972, he was voted the Bob Jones Award, the highest honour given by the United States Golf Association in recognition of distinguished sportsmanship in golf. He has received numerous honours from golfing organisations around the world, culminating in his induction into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 2000.

PATSY HANKINS



atsy Hankins (1945-2015), was one of the most respected golf administrators New Zealand has produced. Her legacy as a trailblazer in golf administration grew because of her long list of achievements and kind and gentle approach. From fostering the development

of the women's game to playing a key role in the amalgamation of men's and women's golf, Patsy was incredibly influential and will leave a long lasting legacy in the game, not only in New Zealand, but around the world.

Patsy was an accomplished player, representing Bay of Plenty Thames Valley, but it was in administration that she really made her mark.

Patsy progressed to the Board of Women's Golf New Zealand in 2000 and, four years later, became their Chair. The process of the amalgamation of men's and women's golf was not easy and it took two years to finalise. Patsy was a key figure, always remaining positive and realising that this would only be good for golf. When New Zealand Golf Incorporated was formed, Patsy was elected the first President, a reflection of the esteem in which she was held.

In 2012, Patsy Hankins was elected Women's Chairman of the IGF, a confirmation of her abilities as a contributor to the game. Her appointment was one of the biggest achievements by a New Zealand golf administrator.

Patsy was bestowed one of the greatest honours in golf when she was offered membership at The Royal and Ancient Golf Club as one of the first seven women accepted. Only recently, Patsy travelled to the home of golf where she became the inaugural women's net medal winner at the Autumn Meeting.

TOURNAMENT HISTORY

The match opposing a team of 12 players from each of Europe and Asia-Pacific was instituted in 1998 and is played biennially, in conjunction with the ladies' equivalent match the "Patsy Hankins Trophy" since 2016. It is named after Sir Michael Bonallack (1934), an English amateur golfer with an exceptional playing record and a leading administrator in world golf in the late 20th century.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

European team selections will be made by selectors who will visit various key championships throughout the season and with the World Amateur Golf Rankings (WAGR) as an overall guide to player performances. Notice will be taken of player match play results in both major individual championships and in national team representative matches - in particular, the European Amateur Team Championship.

Particular notice will be taken of player match play results in both major individual championships and in national team representative matches – in particular, the European Ladies' Team Championship.

SYSTEM OF PLAY

The Patsy Hankins Trophy contests a team of twelve from each of Europe and Asia-Pacific. There are three days of play. The first two days comprise five foursomes matches each morning and five four-ball matches each afternoon. On the final day, all twelve team players compete in singles match play. A win counts as one point, a half yields half a point and a lost match returns zero. In the event of a tie, the trophy shall be retained by the holders.
