ANDREW MORGAN European Captain

Andrew B. Morgan has been appointed Captain to the European Team to contest the Michael Bonallack Trophy (MBT) match against the Asia/Pacific Team in India next April. The match is played over three days with two days of foursomes and four-ball match play with all players competing in singles matchplay on the final day.

Andy, as he is better known, commenced his golfing career as the Captain of the first Welsh Boys Team in 1972. In 1980, he became a member of the Welsh Golf Union's Executive Committee and, in 1994, the Centenary Year of the Welsh Golfing Union, became its youngest President.

Following periods on the European Golf Association (EGA) Ecology Unit, Championship Committee and Executive Committee, Andy became President of the European Golf Association in 2005 and, following that role, represented the European and African Zone on the International Golf Federation.

Today, Andy is a Board Member of Ryder Cup Wales, Chairman of Golf Development Wales and is looking forward to 2010 and the Ryder Cup being played in Wales.

2010 will see the seventh playing of the MBT, which is a showcase for Europe's top amateur golfers. Europe currently lead this biennial series 4-2.

Note: Sir Michael Bonallack was an exceptional amateur golfer. He won the Amateur Championship on five occasions and played in seven Eisenhower Trophies.

From 1984 – 1999 Sir Michael was Secretary of the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews, was knighted for services to golf in 1998 and, in 2000, was inducted to the World Golf Hall of Fame.
