Congratulations to the Top Ranked Players in the European Amateur Golf Ranking 2011. Final results for 2011 (as of 13 September) were:

1	Andrew Sullivan	England	1294.67 pts
2	Tom Lewis	England	1234.78 pts
3	Jack Senior	England	1185.33 pts

English A Squad members have taken the first three places in the 2011 European Amateur Golf Rankings (EAGR). Andrew Sullivan narrowly eclipsed his teammates Tom Lewis and Jack Senior.

Sullivan's 2011 campaign began strongly in Australia with a win in the New South Wales Medal and second place in the New South Wales Amateur Championship - one of the world's most gruelling amateur events. During the tour, he was also runner-up in the Master of the Amateurs. Back in the UK, he followed this success with a win in the Scottish Open Amateur Stroke Play and tied for second in the Brabazon Trophy.

Tom Lewis increased his international recognition in 2011 after leading the Open Championship after the first round with a 65. He also led the Open Championship LFO, made the quarter finals in The Amateur Championship and won the St Andrews Links Trophy.

Jack Senior was the player to edge Sullivan into second in the New South Wales Amateur. Back home, he lifted the Lytham Trophy and was a quarter finalist in The Amateur Championship.

All three have added accolades to the English A Squad, having won the Ashes Match against Australia and the European Nations Cup at Sotogrande.
